

Sections 67-A to 67-S and to follow immediately after Section 67 of said Article, creating a Board of Electrical Examiners and providing for the examination and licensing of electricians employed in the installation of electrical apparatus and wiring in St. Mary's County.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That 19 new sections be and they are hereby added to Article 19 of the Code of Public Local Laws of Maryland (1930 Edition), title "St. Mary's County", to be under sub-title "Electrical Examiners", said new sections to be known as Sections 67-A to 67-S to follow immediately after Section 67 of said Article and to read as follows:

#### Electrical Examiners.

67-A. The Board of County Commissioners of St. Mary's County shall, on or before July 1, 1939, appoint a board which shall be known as the Board of Electrical Examiners, consisting of three persons for the purpose of examining into the qualifications and capabilities of all persons who are engaged or desire to engage in the business of Master Electrician as defined in this sub-title. The Board so appointed shall consist of two competent practical electricians of St. Mary's County, who shall be selected from a list of 4 names recommended to the Board of County Commissioners by the St. Mary's County Electrical Contractors' Association, and the President of the Board of County Commissioners. If any vacancy occurs for any cause during the term of any board as herein provided for, the Board of County Commissioners shall appoint somebody from a list of 2 names recommended by said Electrical Contractors' Association. The Board of County Commissioners shall have full power to remove any member of the board for incompetency or improper conduct by satisfactory evidence being presented to him of such condition.

67-B. The members of said Board shall respectively take and subscribe the oath required by other State officers. They shall have power to elect out of their number, a President, Secretary and Treasurer, and to adopt such rules and by-laws for the transaction of business of the Board as they may deem expedient.

67-C. Each member of said Board shall receive a compensation of five dollars (\$5.00) per day for actual service in attending meetings of the Board, which compensation shall be paid out of any moneys in the hands of the Treas-
