creditor, apply to the court in which the trial judgment was obtained for the privilege of paying such judgment in installments, and the court, in its discretion and without prejudice to any other legal remedies which the judgment creditor may have, may so order, fixing the amounts and times of payment of the installments. While the judgment debtor is not in default in payment of such installments, the Commissioner, upon his giving proof of ability to respond in damages for future accidents, as hereinbefore provided, may, in his discretion, restore or refrain from suspending his license and/or registration certificate or certificates; but such license and/or certificate or certificates shall be suspended as hereinbefore provided if and when the Commissioner is satisfied that the judgment debtor has failed to comply with the terms of the court order.

If any such motor vehicle owner or operator shall not be a resident of this State, the privilege of operating any motor vehicle in this State and the privilege of operation within the State of any motor vehicle owned by him shall be withdrawn while any final judgment against him, as aforesaid, shall be unstayed, unsatisfied and subsisting for more than thirty (30) days, as aforesaid, and shall not be renewed, nor shall any operator's or chauffeur's license be issued to him or any motor vehicle registered in his name until every such judgment shall be stayed, satisfied or discharged as herein provided, and until such person shall have given proof of his ability to respond in damages for future accidents, as required in Section 187A hereof.

Sec. 2. And be it further enacted, That this Act shall take effect June 1, 1939.

CHAPTER 447.

(House Bill 295)

AN ACT to add a new section to Article 23 of the Code of Public Local Laws of Maryland (1930 Edition), title "Wicomico County", subtitle "Foxes", said new section to be known as Section 93A and to follow immediately after Section 93, making it unlawful for any person in Wicomico County to have in possession any red fox pelt or pelts.
