

Any person feeling aggrieved at the action of the supervisors of election in refusing to register him or her, or in striking his or her name, shall have the right of appeal to the Circuit Court in the manner, and according to the procedure now provided for appeals from County Registration officers.

Any person, having the qualifications provided for herein, may become a candidate for Town Commissioner by filing with either of said supervisors of election, at least 15 days prior to the election, a certificate that he is a candidate, that he has the required qualifications, and by giving his age, residence, occupation and a reference to the Land Records showing the ownership of his real estate, provided that such certificate shall be endorsed by at least 20 qualified voters of said Town. The qualifications of said candidate, or of those endorsing him, shall not be subject to review of said supervisors, but may be decided and determined by the Circuit Court for said County either before or after election, in any proper procedure, upon the petition of any five (5) voters. In the event that less than five persons shall file as candidates, or any candidate having filed, dies or withdraws, the said supervisors may receive petitions of candidacy up to within three days of said election. The said supervisors shall, for said election, cause to be made up official ballots, upon clear white paper of a convenient size, in the usual form of County ballots, and shall post a sample or facsimile of said ballot in ten public places not later than the day before said election. The names on said ballots shall be arranged alphabetically with at least five blank spaces in which the voters may write in and vote for one or more candidates, and said ballots shall be voted by making a cross (X) in the square provided opposite the name of each candidate.

The Commissioners of said Town shall at the regular meeting next before the first Monday in May in each biennium appoint two qualified voters of said Town to act as Clerks of Election, and the said two Clerks of Election together with the Supervisors of Election shall attend on the first Monday in May 1942, and on the first Monday in May in each and every second year thereafter, and at such other times as special elections for any purpose may be called under this Act, or under any other Act of Assembly, at the place where such elections are to be held in accordance with the notice thereof posted as aforesaid, and after each taking the constitutional oath of office before some person duly qualified to administer oaths, they shall proceed between the hours of 7 o'clock A. M. and 7 o'clock P. M. on such date to receive the votes of those persons whose names shall be found upon the registration books who shall then and there present themselves for the purpose of voting.
