Edition), title "Elections", sub-title "Offenses", to permit the sale of alcoholic beverages in Baltimore County on election days except during the hours when the polls are open and one hour thereafter.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That Section 157 of Article 33 of the Annotated Code of Maryland (1939 Edition), title "Elections", sub-title "Offenses", be and the same is hereby repealed and re-enacted, with amendments, to read as follows:

157. It shall be unlawful for the keeper of any hotel, tavern, store, drinking establishment or any other place where liquors are sold, or for any person or persons, directly or indirectly, to sell, barter, give or dispose of any spirituous or fermented liquors, ale or beer, or intoxicating drinks of any kind within any election district or precinct of this State on the day of any election hereafter to be held in such district or precinct; any person violating the provisions of this section shall be liable for indictment, and shall, upon conviction, be fined not less than Fifty (\$50.00) Dollars, nor more than One Hundred (\$100.00) Dollars for each offense; provided that in Baltimore County alcoholic beverages may be sold on election days except during the hours when the polls are open and one hour thereafter.

SEC. 2. And be it further enacted, That all other laws whether Public General or Public Local Laws, and particularly all provisions of Article 2B of the Annotated Code of Maryland (1939 Edition) prohibiting the sale of alcoholic beverages on general, special or primary election days, be and they are hereby repealed insofar as they are inconsistent with the provisions of this Act.

Sec. 3. And be it further enacted, That this Act shall take effect June 1, 1941.

CHAPTER 778.

(House Bill 417)

AN ACT to repeal and re-enact, with amendments, Section 11 of Article 66A of the Annotated Code of Maryland (1939 Edition), title "Moving Pictures", relating to the fees for the examination of motion picture films.
