assigned thereto. He shall receive a salary of \$4,000 per annum. The Governor shall designate three other of said justices to be known as magistrates of the Traffic Court, who shall receive salaries of \$3,500 each per annum. The Governor shall also designate the other justice of the peace to be known as the associate magistrate of the Traffic Court who shall receive a salary of \$2,500 per annum.

215. (Jurisdiction.) The magistrates of the Traffic Court shall have exclusive jurisdiction within the City of Baltimore to hear and determine all complaints of violations of the Motor Vehicle Laws of the State, and shall have exclusive jurisdiction, where jurisdiction now or may hereafter be given to any Justice of the Peace in Baltimore City, to try or commit for trial any person accused of violating the Traffic Ordinances of Baltimore City.

219. (Commitment.) In cases of commitment to jail in default of payment of fine the supervisor, assistant supervisor or one of the court clerks shall have the power, upon suitable written order to the warden or other custodian, to release the prisoner at any time after commitment upon payment of the fine and costs imposed, provided, however, that a credit of one dollar (\$1.00) for each day of imprisonment actually served shall be deducted from the payments herein speci-Records shall be kept by said supervisor, assistant supervisor or court clerks of such releases and credits and the fines and costs so received shall be remitted as in the case of fines and costs imposed and collected as otherwise provided herein. The warden or other custodian of prisoners sentenced from the Traffic Court shall have no power or authority to release prisoners committed by traffic court magistrates prior to the expiration of their terms as specified in the commitment papers except upon the written order of the supervisor, assistant supervisor or court clerks as herein provided, or upon order of a court of competent jurisdiction. No fines, costs or other monies shall be paid to any warden or other custodian in cases from the Traffic Court.

220. (Supervisor.) There shall be certain clerical assistants to the magistrates of the Traffic Court as hereinafter provided for, who shall be appointed by the Chief Magistrate of the Traffic Court and, after appointment, be under his supervision and control. One of said clerical assistants shall be designated as Supervisor and shall receive a salary of \$2,600 per annum. He or any clerical employees designated for that purpose shall have the power to fix the amount of and accept bail and he shall perform such other duties as may be assigned to him by the chief magistrate.
