in the Board caused by death or otherwise within sixty days from the date of such vacancies.

443. (a) Said Board of Chiropractic Examiners shall convene within thirty (30) days after their appointment and elect a president, a vice-president and secretary-treas-

urer from their membership.

- (b) Said Board shall hold regular sessions, at such places the board may decide, the first week in January and July, respectively, of each year, and shall publish such dates for examination and place of meeting in some newspaper of general circulation at least fifteen (15) days prior to said meeting.
- Said Board shall have authority to administer (c) oaths, take affidavits, summon witnesses and take testimony as to matters pertaining to their duties. The Board shall have the power in its discretion, to authorize the payment of fees and travelling expenses of witnesses called before the Board and examined in any proceeding properly before the Board. They shall adopt a seal, which shall be affixed to all licenses issued by them and shall from time to time adopt such rules and regulations as they deem proper and necessary for the performance of their duties, which shall be without prejudice, partiality or discrimination as to the different schools of Chiropractic. The secretary of said Board shall keep a record of the proceedings of the Board which shall at all times be open to public inspecspection. Said Board shall also keep on file with the Secretary of State a copy of the rules and regulations for public inspection, and shall elect annually a president, vice-president and secretary-treasurer. A majority of the Board shall constitute a quorum.
- (d) A license to practice Chiropractic within this State shall be issued to the individual members of said Board at first meeting of said Board upon payment of the regular fee as provided for in this sub-title.
- 445. (a) Any person wishing to practice Chiropractic in this State, before it shall be lawful for him to do so, shall make application to said Board of Chiropractic Examiners, through the Secretary-Treasurer thereof, upon form thereof and in such manner as to be adopted and directed by the Board, at least ten (10) days prior to any meeting of said Board. Each applicant, prior to January 1, 1943, shall be a graduate of a Chiropractic school or college which teaches a resident course of three (3) years, of six (6) months each, with a minimum of two thousand (2,000) sixty minute hours, or more, or the equivalent
