

generally promote the business of the County Commissioners' office in said County, and for that purpose all the provisions of this sub-title shall be liberally construed and all powers heretofore belonging to the collectors of taxes in said County and so far as the same will facilitate the Treasurer of said County in the discharge of his duties hereunder, shall be possessed by and are hereby given to said Treasurer; but he shall not by implication be held to possess any of the powers of such collectors as might tend to delay him in the discharge of his duties, or render the purpose of this sub-title difficult.

SEC. 2. *And be it further enacted,* That should any section or part of a section of this Act be held to be invalid for any reason, such holding shall not be construed as affecting the validity of any remaining section or part of a section of this Act, it being the legislative intent that the remainder of this Act shall stand, notwithstanding the invalidity of such section or part of such section or part of a section.

SEC. 3. *And be it further enacted,* That all laws or parts of laws, inconsistent with the provisions of this Act, be and they are hereby repealed to the extent of such inconsistency.

SEC. 4. *And be it further enacted,* That this Act shall take effect June 1, 1941.

CHAPTER 512.

(Senate Bill 323)

AN ACT to require the Board of Trustees of the State Retirement System to pay a retirement allowance to Paul C. Dogge.

WHEREAS, Paul C. Dogge was employed for a period of of more than twelve years by the State Roads Commission, and

WHEREAS, In May, 1930, his leg was amputated as a result of injuries suffered during such employment, and

WHEREAS, He would have then been eligible for a retirement allowance if the pension system created by Article 73B had then been in effect, and
