Edition), title "Time—Standard", said new section to be known as Section 2, to follow immediately after Section 1 of said Article and to read as follows:

- In computing any period of time prescribed or allowed by the rules of any Court, or by order of Court, or by any applicable statute, the day of the act, event, or default, after which the designated period of time begins to run is not to be included. The last day of the period so computed is to be included unless: (1) It is a Sunday or a legal holiday, in which event the period runs until the end of the next day, which is neither a Sunday or a holiday; or, (2) the act to be done is the filing of some paper in Court, and the Office of the Clerk of said Court on said last day of the period is not open, or is closed for a part of a day, in which event, the period runs until the end of the next day which is neither a Sunday, Saturday, a legal holiday, or a day on which the said office is not open the entire day during ordinary business hours. When the period of time allowed is more than seven days, intermediate Sundays and holidays shall be considered as other days: but if the period or time allowed is seven days or less, intermediate Sundays and holidays shall not be counted in computing the period of time.
- SEC. 2. And be it further enacted, That this Act shall take effect June 1, 1941.

CHAPTER 523.

(Senate Bill 370)

AN ACT to repeal and re-enact, with amendments, Section 35 of Article 66B of the Annotated Code of Maryland (1939 Edition), title "Zoning and Planning", subtitle "Planning", sub-heading "Title V. General Provisions" eliminating Talbot County from the list of counties exempt from said sub-title.

SECTION 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That Section 35 of Article 66B of the Annotated Code of Maryland (1939 Edition), title "Zoning and Planning", sub-title "Planning", sub-heading "Title V. General Provisions", be and it is hereby repealed and reenacted, with amendments, to read as follows:
