CHAPTER 532.

(Senate Bill 414)

AN ACT to repeal and re-enact with amendments Section 196, sub-section (5) of Article 56 of the Annotated Code of Maryland (1939 Edition), title "Licenses", sub-title "Speed, Size, Weight, Construction and Equipment of Motor Vehicles", providing penalties for violations of the maximum of speed limits of motor vehicles.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That Section 196, sub-section (5) of Article 56 of the Annotated Code of Maryland (1939 Edition), title "Licenses", sub-title "Speed, Size, Weight, Construction and Equipment of Motor Vehicles", be and the same is hereby repealed and re-enacted with amendments to read as follows:

196.

(5) (Penalties) Any person violating any of the provisions of Sub-sections (1) or (3) of this section shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and subject to a fine of not less than one dollar (\$1.00) nor more than one hundred dollars for the first offense. Any person violating any of the provisions of Sub-section (2) of this section shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and subject to a fine of not less than five dollars (\$5.00) nor more than one hundred dollars (\$100.00) for the first offense. Any person operating a motor vehicle upon any highway of this State at a rate of speed greater than fifty miles per hour, or fifty-five miles per hour on dual lane boulevard highways, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and subject, upon conviction, to a fine of not less than five dollars (\$5.00) nor more than one hundred dollars (\$100.00). Any person operating a motor vehicle upon any highway of this State at a rate of speed greater than seventy miles per hour shall be subject, upon conviction, to a fine of not less than twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) nor more than one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00), or to be imprisoned for not less than fifteen days nor more than one year, or to both fine and imprisonment, for the first offense; and any per-
