CHAPTER 784.

(Senate Bill 325)

AN ACT to repeal and re-enact, with amendments, Section 110 of Article 52 of the Code of Public General Laws of Maryland, title "Justices of the Peace", sub-title Trial Magistrates System", as said section was amended by Chapter 349 of the Acts of 1941, providing for an increase in salary for the Substitute Trial Magistrate of Prince George's County.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That Section 110 of Article 52 of the Code of Public General Laws of Maryland, title "Justices of the Peace," sub-title "Trial Magistrates System," as said section was amended by Chapter 349 of the Acts of 1941, be, and the same is hereby, repealed and re-enacted, with amendments, to read as follows:

110. (Substitute Magistrates.) In addition to the justices of the peace and justices of the peace at large hereinbefore specified, the Governor, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate, shall appoint one justice of the peace at large for each county of the State who shall be designated "Substitute Trial Magistrate." Such magistrate shall post the bond required of trial magistrates and shall receive a salary of \$100.00 per year, except the substitute magistrate appointed for Baltimore County, who shall receive \$1,000.00 per year in addition to the compensation received when actually sitting as a substitute as hereinafter provided, and except the substitute magistrate appointed for Prince George's County, who shall receive \$1,300.00 per year, in addition to the compensation received when actually sitting as a substitute as hereinafter provided.
