

CHAPTER 831.

(Senate Bill 437)

AN ACT to repeal and re-enact, with amendments, Section 579 of Article 22 of the Code of Public Local Laws of Maryland (1930 Edition), title "Washington County," sub-title "Keedysville," changing the corporate name of Keedysville from "The Burgess and Commissioners of Keedysville" to "The Mayor and Council of Keedysville."

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That Section 579 of Article 22 of the Code of Public Local Laws of Maryland (1930 Edition), title "Washington County," sub-title "Keedysville," be and it is hereby repealed and re-enacted, with amendments, to read as follows:

579. The citizens of Keedysville, in Washington County, are a body corporate, by the name of "The Mayor and Council of Keedysville," and by that name may sue and be sued, and have and use a common seal.

SEC. 2. *And be it further enacted,* That on and after the effective date of this Act, wherever the burgess and/or the commissioners of Keedysville are referred to in public local or public general laws of Maryland, said reference shall be considered and construed to mean mayor and/or council of Keedysville, and a reference to a commissioner shall mean a member of the council.

SEC. 3. *And be it further enacted,* That this Act shall take effect June 1, 1943.
