the precinct in which each vacancy may occur; the said Board of Supervisors of Election of the City of Hagerstown shall record every appointment so made in a book to be kept for that purpose, and shall make out a warrant for such appointment and shall within two days thereafter deliver unto the Chief of Police of the City of Hagerstown, under the penalty of fifty dollars, who shall deliver such warrant to the person appointed as such judge of election, or leave the same at his last place of abode within two days next after the delivery of each of the said warrants to him under the penalty of Fifty Dollars: said Board of Supervisors of Election of the City of Hagerstown shall likewise cause similar warrants to be delivered to such clerks or other officers of election as are now or may be hereafter required by law. The compensation for each of said judges of election shall be Five Dollars for each election.

SEC. 2. And be it further enacted, That this Act shall take effect June 1, 1943.

CHAPTER 957.

(Senate Bill 604)

AN ACT to repeal and re-enact, with amendments, Subsection (3) of Section 26 of Article 40 of the Annotated Code of Maryland (1939 Edition), title "General Assembly," sub-title "Legislative Council," as said subsection was enacted by Chapter 887 of the Acts of 1941, relating to vacancies in the Legislative Council and in the office of Chairman and Vice-Chairman of said Council.

SECTION 1. Beitenacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That Sub-section (3) of Section 26 of Article 40 of the Annotated Code of Maryland (1939 Edition), title "General Assembly," sub-title "Legislative Council," as said sub-section was enacted by Chapter 887 of the Acts of 1941, be and it is hereby repealed and re-enacted, with amendments, to read as follows:

26.

(3) Any vacancy occurring in the membership of the Council other than in the offices of Chairman and Vice-Chairman while the General Assembly is not in session
