branch of the Organized Militia, except the National Guard, shall be exempt from jury service. Honorary membership in any branch of the Organized Militia except the National Guard shall not at any time be a cause of exemption from jury service.

- 58E. Use in this State. The Governor shall have the power in case of insurrection, invasion, tumult, riot, breach of peace or imminent danger thereof, or to enforce the laws of this State, to order into service any part of the Maryland State Guard that he may deem proper. When the Militia is on active service, the Commanding Officer and his subordinates shall be, and they are hereby invested with all the authority of sheriffs and deputy sheriffs in enforcing the laws of this State, and they may cooperate with the civil authorities, or take entire charge of the situation as in the judgment of the commanding officer the exigencies of the case may require.
- SEC. 2. And be it further enacted, That this Act is hereby declared to be an emergency law and necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health and safety, and being passed upon a yea and nay vote, supported by three-fifths of all the members elected to each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, the same shall take effect from the date of its passage.
