

the balance to be paid to the State Game Protection Fund. On proof that the holder of such certificate has captured or killed any bird or fur-bearing animal or taken the nest or eggs of any bird for other than scientific purposes, the certificate shall become void.

(a) The certificates authorized by this Section shall expire on the 31st day of December of the year issued and shall not be transferable.

FERRETS AND WEASELS.

31. It shall be unlawful for any person or persons in this State at any time to use any ferret or weasel for the purpose of hunting, capturing, or killing any game birds or game animals which are protected by law.

POISON.

32. It shall be unlawful for any person or persons to kill, attempt to kill or injure by poison any game birds or game animals protected by law, or any domestic poultry.

FIELD TRIALS.

33. The Game Warden is authorized to grant permits to bona fide Field Trial Clubs and Associations to hold field trials with raccoon or opossum, bird or rabbit dogs in this State any time during the closed season under such rules and regulations as may be adopted by said Game Warden safeguarding the interest of the wildlife in this State.

34. PERMIT TO CLUBS. It shall be unlawful to hold field trials with dogs in this State during any closed hunting season unless permission to do so is granted by the Game Warden, and any Club or Association holding a field trial during any closed hunting season shall not be allowed to shoot, or shoot at any game of any species which is protected by law.

Any person or persons owning any raccoon or opossum, bird or rabbit dog or dogs, who desires to train said dog or dogs during any closed hunting season for the purpose of entering said dog or dogs in any field trial must secure a permit by applying to the Game Warden to train said dog or dogs during any closed hunting season.

35. NON-RESIDENT DOGS. Dogs brought into this State to participate in such field trials and which are to be removed from the State within fifteen days after said field trials are held shall be exempted from the payment of State, City, or County license tax.
