Gentlemen of the Senate:

The House of Delegates, pursuant to the Governor's proclamation, has met in Special Session and having organized by the election of the Honorable C. Ferdinand Sybert, Speaker, and Raymond H. Miller, Chief Clerk, is now ready to proceed with the business of the session.
