voting machine installed in each precinct on the days of any registrations prior to the primary and general elections with a judge of election in attendance in order that full instructions in the use of such machines may be given on these registration days; and be it further

Resolved, That this resolution be spread upon the Journal of the House and that the Chief Clerk be and he is hereby instructed to send a copy of this resolution to the Supervisors of Elections of Baltimore City and to the Supervisors of Elections in each county in this State which makes use of voting machines.

Which was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Elections.

House Resolution expressing the sympathies of the House of Delegates over the untimely death of the Honorable James J. Lacy.

WHEREAS, the members of the House of Delegates of Maryland were shocked to hear of the untimely death of the Honorable James J. Lacy on July 1, 1950; and
