

CHAP. 66. law or usage in this State, to be collected in the same manner as other small debts are now recoverable.

Construction. SEC. 5. *And be it enacted,* That nothing herein contained shall be construed as granting banking privileges to said company or exempting their property from taxation.

Reservation. SEC. 6. *And be it enacted,* That the Legislature reserves to itself the right to alter or repeal this act at pleasure.

In force. SEC. 7. *And be it enacted,* That this act shall take effect from the day of its passage.

CHAPTER 66.

Passed Feb. 24, 1860. AN ACT, to refund to Joseph Wells, former tax Collector of Cecil county, a sum of money erroneously paid by him into the State Treasury.

Money re- funded. SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the Treasurer, upon the warrant of the Comptroller, be and he is hereby ordered to pay to Joseph Wells, late tax collector in the third election district of Cecil county, the sum of nineteen dollars and seventy-five cents erroneously paid by him into the State Treasury.

In force. SEC. 2. *Be it enacted,* That this act shall take effect from the date of its passage.
