CHAPTER 79.

CHAP. 81.

AN ACT to change the name of William Henry Hutton, of Washington county, to William Henry Earhart. Passed Feb. 24, 1860

*Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That from and after the passage of this act, the name of Willian Henry Hutton, of Washington county, be and the same is hereby changed to William Henry Earhart, and that he shall be at all times and in all respects entitled to use the name of William Henry Earhart, as if he had always been called and known by that name. Name changed.

CHAPTER 80.

AN ACT for the benefit of Brice Brown. Passed Feb. 14, 1860.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted, by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the county commissioners of Carroll county, are hereby authorised and required to levy upon the assessable property of said county the sum of fifty dollars annually for the benefit of Brice Brown. Levy.

SEC. 2. *Be it enacted,* That this act shall take effect from the date of its passage. In force.

CHAPTER 81.

AN ACT to authorise Samuel S. Cunningham, of Washington county, to bring into this State a certain negro boy a slave for a term of years. Passed Feb. 17, 1860.

*Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* from and after the passage of this act, it shall and may be lawful for Samuel S. Cunningham, of Leave given.
