

CHAP. 214. residue of the dog tax hereby imposed, after deducting the constable's fees for returning said lists, collecting said tax and killing dogs, and every constable shall be allowed twenty-five cents for each dog or bitch killed by him under the provisions of the preceding sections.

**Surplus.** SEC. 16. Any surplus that may remain on hand of the said tax, on the first day of January in any year, after deducting all charges hereinbefore provided for, and all sums paid for sheep killed or injured by dogs, shall be paid by the county commissioners to the treasurer of the board of school commissioners of Harford county, for the use of public schools.

**In force.** SEC. 17. *And be it enacted,* That this act shall take effect from its passage.

#### CHAPTER 214.

**Passed March 9, 1860.** AN ACT entitled, an act to provide for the transmission to the Circuit Court for Washington county, of certain copies of papers and proceedings in the case of Robert Gilmer vs. Brien, removed from the High Court of Chancery, to the Superior Court of Baltimore city.

**Preamble.** WHEREAS, it is represented to this General Assembly, that the papers and proceedings in the case of Robert Gilmer vs. Brien, in the late High court of Chancery have been transmitted to the Superior court of Baltimore city, and that the lands and premises mentioned and described in the said proceedings lie exclusively in Washington county, and that the titles of many persons in said county, owning parcels of said lands are involved in the said proceedings which are not accessible to them; Therefore,
