SEC. 2. And be it enacted, That the said William Thompson, of R., shall in every instance bedavit. fore he shall proceed to the aforesaid collection, make affidavit before some justice of the peace for Montgomery county, that the same remains unpaid to the best of his knowledge and belief, and that he has not received any security or satisfaction for the same, or any part thereof, more than the credit thereon; Provided, that said affidavit, shall not be held to be conclusive evidence of indebtedness to said William Thompson, of R., as trustee to William O. Chappell, but merely prima facia evidence of such indebtedness.
