

CHAP. 387. the city of Baltimore, shall, for their counties and for the city of Baltimore, respectively, designate from time to time the persons who are to enjoy the privileges of said free scholarship.

Vancancies in free scholarships. SEC. 5. *And be it enacted*, That the trustees of the Baltimore Female College shall from time to time advise the aforesaid Orphans' courts of the several counties and of the city of Baltimore, respectively, of any existing or expected vacancies in the said free scholarship, so that they may be kept at all times one pupil from each county and from the city of Baltimore, in the enjoyment of the privileges of education thus secured to the several counties of the State and the city of Baltimore.

Pro rata amount. SEC. 6. *And be it enacted*, That after such notification, any vacancy shall exist in consequence of the Orphans' court of any of the counties not having any beneficiary to recommend, then the trustees of the said college shall be entitled only to a *pro rata* amount of the fifteen hundred dollars according to the number of pupils actually educated for the State as hereinbefore provided.

Report. SEC. 7. *And be it enacted*, That the trustees of the Baltimore Female College shall send a report of the condition of the said institution to the General Assembly of Maryland at each session of the Legislature, and a report to the Governor of the State each year in which the Legislature is not in session.

CHAPTER 388.

Passed March 9, 1860. AN ACT to amend the one hundred and tenth, one hundred and eleventh, one hundred and twelfth, and one hundred and thirteenth sections, relating to penalties for selling lottery tickets of article thirty, of the Code of Public General Laws, and to add the following sections thereto for suppressing lotteries.
