

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That Section 393 of the Code of Public Local Laws of Prince George's County, Maryland, (Flack's Edition, 1943), as enacted by Chapter 538 of the Acts of 1937, be, and it is hereby repealed and re-enacted with amendments, to read as follows:

393. The County Commissioners of Prince George's County shall in the month of June, 1937, and every two years thereafter appoint a Motor Vehicle Transfer Clerk for Prince George's County, who shall, subject to the control, direction and decision of the said County Commissioners, correct and keep the assessment records of Prince George's County relating to motor vehicles liable to assessment in said county, so that the same will correctly show the actual owner or owners of each motor vehicle owned by a resident of Prince George's County or taxable in said County. To this end the said Motor Vehicle Transfer Clerk shall compile and keep such records and memoranda in connection therewith as the County Commissioners may from time to time direct and shall in addition thereto perform such other and further duties as the County Commissioners of Prince George's County may impose upon said clerk. Before entering upon the duties of the office, the said Motor Vehicle Transfer Clerk shall take an oath before any of said County Commissioners of Prince George's County that he or she, as the case may be, will without partiality or prejudice, discharge the duties of the office of Motor Vehicle Transfer Clerk. The said Motor Vehicle Transfer Clerk so appointed shall be entitled to a salary of not exceeding Two Thousand Dollars (\$2,000.00) per annum, payable in equal semi-monthly installments which shall be in full for all and any services rendered by said Motor Vehicle Transfer Clerk at the direction of the County Commissioners.

SEC. 2. *And be it further enacted*, That this Act shall take effect on the first day of July, 1945.
