Gregory for 91¼ acres of land recorded among the said Land Records in Liber J. W. B. 13 at folio 190,

(10) South 27° 26' West 433.46 feet to a pipe on the east side of Addison Road, formerly known as Addison Chapel Road; thence with the east side of Addison Road the three fol-

lowing courses and distances,

(11) South 27° 23' East 149.50 feet to a pipe; thence,

(12) South 35° 50' East 296.00 to a pipe; thence,

- (13) South 21° 59′ 20″ East 115.89 feet to the place of beginning, containing 2,191,839 square feet or 50.318 acres of land, more or less. That all of the territory hereby annexed to the Town of Seat Pleasant shall after the date of the passage of this Act, be subject to all laws, ordinances and regulations of said Town.
- SEC. 2. And be it further enacted, That this Act is hereby declared to be an emergency law and necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health and safety and having been passed upon by yea and nay vote, supported by three-fifths of all the members elected to each of the two Houses of the General Assembly of Maryland, the same shall take effect from the date of its passage.

(House Bill 655)
