

tion 37A, to follow immediately after Section 37 of said Article, and to read as follows:

37A. The State's Attorneys of the several Counties of the State shall receive annually the respective salaries herewith set forth for performing the duties required of them by their respective Public Local Laws and by the Public General Laws of the State, and such expenses as are now provided for by law in the several Counties, the said salaries and expenses to be paid by the respective counties:

The State's Attorney of Howard County shall receive an annual salary of \$2,000.00.

The State's Attorneys of Caroline, Charles, Kent, Queen Anne's and Worcester Counties shall each receive an annual salary of \$1,500.00.

The State's Attorney of Talbot County shall receive an annual salary of \$1,800.00.

The State's Attorneys of Calvert, St. Mary's and Somerset Counties shall each receive an annual salary of \$2,000.00.

The State's Attorney of Dorchester County shall receive an annual salary of \$2,400.00.

The State's Attorney of Harford County shall receive an annual salary of \$2,500.00.

The State's Attorney of Carroll County shall receive an annual salary of \$2,700.00.

The State's Attorneys of Cecil and Wicomico Counties shall each receive an annual salary of \$3,000.00.

The State's Attorney of Frederick County shall receive an annual salary of \$3,600.00.

The State's Attorney of Anne Arundel County shall receive an annual salary of \$4,000.00.

The State's Attorney of Allegany County shall receive an annual salary of not less than \$4,000.00 nor more than \$4,800.00, in the discretion of the County Commissioners of said County. The Assistant State's Attorney of Allegany County shall receive an annual salary of \$3,000.00.

The State's Attorney of Prince George's County shall receive an annual salary of \$4,800.00 and the Assistant State's Attorney of Prince George's County shall receive an annual salary of \$2,000.00.

The salaries fixed by this section shall commence as of the effective date of the amendment to Section 9 of Article 5 of the Constitution of Maryland proposed by Chapter 490 of the Acts of the General Assembly, 1943 Session, and adopted by the qualified voters of the State at the general election held on November 7, 1944.

No State's Attorney shall receive any other compensation, commission, or emolument of any kind for performing his duties as State's Attorney but any fees to which
