

332C. In the event said fire company ceases to be an active fire fighting organization, or if the funds provided for herein are not used for the purposes set forth in Sections 332A-332C of this sub-title, or if restrictive rules or regulations are adopted by said company with respect to the area within which it will respond to emergency or fire calls, then, and in any of said events, the said County Commissioners shall cease to levy the said fire tax.

332D. The Linthicum Heights Community Fire Company shall give bond to the County Commissioners of Anne Arundel County in a penal sum to be set by them conditioned upon the faithful expenditure of the funds derived hereunder.

SEC. 2. *And be it further enacted*, That before any tax shall be levied under the provisions of this Act, the question of such levy shall first be submitted to the legally qualified voters of the second precinct of the Fifth Election District in a special election to be held at the fire house of the Linthicum Heights Community Fire Company on the first Tuesday of June, 1949. There shall be printed on the ballot to be used at said election the title of this Act and underneath said title, on separate lines, a square or box to the right of and opposite the words "For Fire Tax", and a corresponding square or box to the right of and opposite the words "Against Fire Tax", so that the voters shall be able to designate by a cross-mark in the proper square or box his or her decision for or against said fire tax. If a majority of the votes cast in said election shall be "For Fire Tax", then said tax shall be levied and paid over in accordance with the provisions of this Act, but if a majority of the votes cast shall be "Against Fire Tax", then this Act shall be of no effect and shall be null and void.

Sec. 3. *And be it further enacted*, That this Act shall take effect June 1, 1949.

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CHAPTER 536

(House Bill 271)

AN ACT to authorize and empower the Mayor and City Council of Hyattsville to issue bonds of the City of Hyattsville in a sum not exceeding One Hundred Thousand Dollars
