investments to a sum of \$100,000.00 shall be retained by said electrical department and the balance of said operating profits if any shall be paid to the said general funds of the Mayor and Council of Easton.

Sec. 2. And be it further enacted, That this Act shall take effect June 1, 1949.

CHAPTER 657

(House Bill 761)

AN ACT to repeal and re-enact, with amendments, Section 330 of Article 21 of the Code of Public Local Laws of Maryland (1930 Edition), title "Talbot County", sub-title "Oxford", increasing the compensation of the town commissioners of said town, and changing time for holding town elections.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That Section 330 of Article 21 of the Code of Public Local Laws of Maryland (1930 Edition), title "Talbot County", sub-title "Oxford", be and it is hereby repealed and reenacted, with amendments, to read as follows:

330. Said commissioners shall be three in number; and all male inhabitants above the age of twenty-one years, who shall have had a bona fide residence in said town for six months, and twelve months in the State next preceding the election, or who shall be the holder of real property within the limits of said town, and have resided six months in Talbot County, and twelve months in the State, shall elect by ballot, on the second Tuesday in July in each year, at such time and place as shall be designated by the commissioners, one person above the age of twenty-one years, and who has resided in said town at least twelve months next preceding said election, commissioner; the person so elected shall serve for a term of three years; each of said three commissioners shall receive a salary of One Hundred Dollars a year.

Sec. 2. And be it further enacted, That this Act is hereby declared to be an emergency measure and necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health and safety, and having been passed by a yea and nay vote, supported by
