Chapter 1051 of the Acts of 1945, be and they are hereby repealed and re-enacted, with amendments, to read as follows:

16.

- (a) The Mayor and Common Council shall have full power and authority to levy annually upon all the property of the Town, subject to assessment and tax for State and County purposes, such taxes and at such rates as may be necessary, in its judgment, for the anticipated expenses of the next succeeding fiscal year, not to exceed \$0.50 on the One Hundred Dollars (\$100) of assessed valuation.
- (b) Real property, within the Town of College Park, having the character of rural and undeveloped and unimproved land, woodland, or land primarily for farming purposes shall be a class of property and a rate of tax may be levied thereon different from the rate to be levied on all other property within the Town, and said different rate of tax on said class shall in no case exceed \$0.20 on the One Hundred Dollars (\$100) assessed valuation.
- (d) The Treasurer of the Town of College Park upon receiving notice from the Treasurer of Prince George's County, as is provided for in Section 74 of Article 81 of the Code of Public General Laws of Maryland (1947 Supplement), not later than 30 days after receipt of said notice from the Treasurer of Prince George's County, shall certify to said County Treasurer a statement of all taxes due the Town of College Park and the payment of said taxes shall be enforced in accordance with the provisions of the Code of Public General Laws of Maryland relating to tax sales generally, as provided by Section 72 to 90V, inclusive, of Article 81 of said Code (1947 Supplement). The payment of said taxes may be enforced in any other manner now provided by law. Taxes on personal property shall be collected as is now provided by law for the collection of such taxes due Prince George's County.
- SEC. 2. And be it further enacted, That the repeal and reenactment, with amendments, of Sub-sections (a) and (b) of Section 16 of Chapter 1051 of the Acts of 1945 shall not become effective until said sub-sections have been submitted to the qualified voters of the Town of College Park, in Prince George's County, at the next regular municipal election on the first Monday in May, 1949. There shall be printed on the ballots to be used at said election the title of this Act, and underneath said title on separate lines, a square or box to the right of and opposite the words "For Increased Property Tax Rate", and a corresponding square or box to
