of, upon a statement on the oath of the said commissioners of the amount thereof; provided, the expenses shall not exceed in Frederick county, the sum of one hun\_red and fifty dollars, nor in Carroll county the sum of five hundred dollars.

SEC. 3. And be it enucted, That the commissioners, or a Ascertain damajority of them, shall ascertain the damage that may be sustained by any person or persons through whose lands the said road may pass, taking into consideration the advantages and disadvantages to them; and the damages so How paid ascertained shall be levied and assessed in the same manner as directed in the second section of this bill.

SEC. 4. And be it enacted, That the commissioners, be-Oath of office fore they shall proceed to act, shall take an oath or affirmation, as the case may be, before some justice of the peace, that they will without favor, partiality or prejudice, assess the damages sustained by the persons through whose

lands the said road shall pass.

SEC. 5. And be it enucted, That nothing contained in this Right of appeal act shall be so construed as to prevent the right of appeal, in like manner as though the commissioners had been ap-

pointed in the usual way.

SEC. 6. And be it enacted, That this act shall be entirely Acceptance revoid unless it shall be approved by the commissioners of tax of Carroll county, and the levy court of Frederick county; and the commissioners therein named shall not proceed to lay out or open the said road, or do any thing whatever in execution of this act, unless both the levy court of Frederick county and the commissioners of tax of Carroll county shall assent thereto, by orders in writing, to be passed by the said respective boards.

## CHAPTER 166.

An act to authorise Richard R. Waters, late Steriff and Passed Feb. 27, Collector of Montgomery County, to complete his Collections.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Time extended Maryland, That Richard R. Waters, late sheriff and collector of Montgomery county, be and he is hereby authorised to collect until the first day of March, eighteen hundred and forty-three, all fines, forfeitures, amercements, officers fees, public dues and county taxes, which were placed
