Preamble

WHEREAS, Thomas Jenkins, Lemuel Steward, John Doming, Charles Turner, and others, by their petition to this General Assembly, have set forth, that they have formed themselves into an association, by the name of the Newington Beneficial Society, for the purpose of providing a fund, by small periodical contributions in time of health, for the relief of each other and their respective families in the event of sickness, distress and death; and whereas, the
