

**CHAP. 198.**      **SEC. 6.** *And be it enacted,* That the said corporation and their successors, by the name aforesaid, shall be able and capable in law to sue and be sued, plead and be impleaded, answer and be answered unto, defend and be defended in all our courts of justice, and before all or any judges, officers, or persons whatsoever, in all singular actions, matters and demands whatsoever; and that all legal processes that may hereafter be instituted by the said corporation shall be in the name of the president and stewards of the Franklin Beneficial Total Abstinence Society of Fell's Point, and that all processes that may be hereafter instituted against the said society, shall be served on the president on the behalf of the same.

**To use a seal**      **SEC. 7.** *And be it enacted,* That it shall and may be lawful for the said corporation and their successors hereafter to have a common seal for their use, and the same at the will and pleasure of them, and their successors, to change, alter, break and make anew, from time to time, as they shall think best.

**If dissolution be deemed necessary**      **SEC. 8.** *And be it enacted,* That if at any time it may be deemed necessary to dissolve this association, a proposition to that effect shall be laid on the table in writing, at a stated meeting of the society, and may be discussed at their next stated or special meeting, but shall not be finally decided on until it has been one full month before the society, and shall not take effect, unless three-fourths of the members residing within the city and precincts of Baltimore, are in favor thereof.

**Banking forbid**      **SEC. 9.** *And be it enacted,* That nothing in this act shall be so construed as to authorise the said corporation to issue any note, scrip, token, device, or other evidence of debt, to be used as currency.

**In force**      **SEC. 10.** *And be it enacted,* That this act of incorporation shall endure for thirty years; and that the Legislature reserve itself the right to change or annul this act at pleasure.
