CHAPTER 206.

*An act for the better regulating the Harbor and Port of Baltimore.* Passed Mar. 5, 1841.

WHEREAS, there are millions of feet of sawed lumber floated in rafts into the port of Baltimore, and there washed and drawn out of the water, by which large deposits of mud are made in said harbor, to the injury of the navigation of vessels, as also, adding much to the expense of cleaning the docks and harbor within the city or port of Baltimore—therefore,

Preamble

*Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That from and after the passage of this act, the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore shall have full power and authority, and they are required to assess, levy and collect, on every thousand feet of lumber floated into or arriving at the said port of Baltimore, and washed therein, a sum not exceeding thirty cents per thousand feet board measure, and not less than fifteen cents per thousand feet board measure, excepting however, all timber floated into, or arriving at the said port, for the purpose of being sawed in said city or its vicinity, as also all the timber to be used for masts, spars and wharfing timber, to be appropriated and applied by the Mayor and City Council of the city of Baltimore, to the carrying into effect the rules and regulations which they may, from time to time, make, respecting the harbor and port of Baltimore.

CHAPTER 207.
