CHAP. 228.

An additional supplement to the act, entitled an act to incorporate a Company for erecting a Bridge over Chester River, at Chestertown. Passed Mar. 9, 1841.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, May purchase stock, &c
That from and after the passage of this act, it shall and may be lawful for the president and directors of the Chester River Bridge Company to purchase and hold, for the benefit of the stockholders of said company, any shares of stock of said company, and to invest from time to time, any surplus belonging to said company in the shares of stock of the same, if in the judgment of the said president and directors such purchase or investment would be for the benefit of said company. CHAPTER 227.

An act to make valid certain Deeds.

Passed Mar. 9, 1841.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, Deeds made valid
That the deed executed on the sixteenth day of May, eighteen hundred and thirty-five, by Samuel Moffit, and Francis Henry and Elizabeth his wife, to Nimrod Frizzel, of Carroll county, and also the deed executed before that time by John Leister to Thomas Longmore, and also the deed executed by Thomas Longmore to the said Moffit and Henry for the same land, be and the same are hereby declared to be as valid and effectual to vest the title to the said land in the said Frizzel, as if at the time of the execution of said deeds the said Samuel Moffit and the said Thomas Longmore had been naturalized citizens of the United States.

CHAPTER 228.

An act to confirm the titles of Purchasers under the Deeds therein referred to. Passed Mar. 9, 1841.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, Deeds made valid
That all deeds heretofore made and executed by trustees
