

## CHAPTER 243.

CHAP. 245.

*An act to divorce Josephine Hawke, of the City of Annapolis, from her husband Richard James Hawke.* Passed Mar. 10, 1841.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* Divorced That Josephine Hawke, of the city of Annapolis, be, and she is hereby divorced from her husband Richard James Hawke, *a mensa et thoro.*

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted,* That the said Josephine Hawke shall be entitled to all the rights and privileges, and subject to all the responsibilities of a feme sole, except the privilege of marrying again during the life of her said husband. To act as feme sole.

SEC. 3. *And be it enacted,* That the said Richard James Hawke shall have no control over, or right to any property acquired, or to be acquired by the said Josephine Hawke, from and after the passage of this act; but all such property shall enure to the sole use and benefit of the said Josephine Hawke, just as if she had never been married. Rights secured.

## CHAPTER 244.

*An act to divorce Mary Dukes, of Worcester County, from her husband John Dukes.* Passed Mar. 10, 1841.

*Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* Divorced That Mary Dukes be and she is hereby divorced from her husband John Dukes, *a mensa et thoro.*

## CHAPTER 245.

*An act to divorce Nancy A. Hughes, of Allegany County, from her husband Robert H. Hughes.* Passed Mar. 9, 1841.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* Divorced That Nancy Ann Hughes, of Allegany county, be and she is hereby divorced from her husband Robert H. Hughes, *a vinculo matrimonii.*

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted,* That the said Nancy Ann Hughes shall henceforth be called and known by her maiden name, Nancy Ann Unger. To take and use maiden name.
