## CHAPTER 251.

Passed Mar. 9, An act, entitled an act to provide for the Inspection of 1841. Staves and Heading in Port Deposit Town, in Cecil County.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Governor to appoint an inspec Maryland, That the Governor, by and with the advice tor annually and consent of the Senate, shall annually appoint an inspector of staves and heading for the town of Port Deposit,

Oath of office in Cecil county; and the inspector, before he shall enter upon the duties of his office, shall make oath or affirmation before some justice of the peace, that he will discharge his duty as inspector of staves and heading, without partiality or favor, to the best of his skill and knowledge.

SEC. 2. And be it enacted, That the rules and regulations Inspection and fees regulated for the inspection of staves and heading in the town of Port Deposit, shall in all respects conform to the ordinances of the city of Baltimore for the inspection of staves and heading, so far as regards the size and quality of such staves and heading, and the fees to be paid for inspecting the same.
