WHEREAS, the lot on which the State Tobacco Warehouses numbers three and four are erected, in the city of Baltimore, is subject to a ground rent of four hundred forty-eight dollars and eleven cents annually, and payable to a certain John J. Myer; and the said Myer having proposed to release the same to the State for such an amount of five per cent. bonds as will pay annually the said sum of four hundred forty-eight dollars and eleven cents-therefore,

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Governor be, and he is hereby authorised and required, to purchase the said lease; and so soon as the said John J.
