

CHAP. 15. quest of any owner or occupant that makes the distress, or
 To be appraised and sold seizes the property aforesaid; and the articles of property
 so seized and distrained for damages done upon the shores,
 shall be appraised and sold, and the seizure or distress be
 in every way conducted and disposed of, as if the same
 had been laid by a landlord for rent due and in arrear to
 him.

Non-residents **SEC. 2.** *And be it enacted,* That if any non-resident of
 not to haul in the counties through which said river shall pass, shall haul
 500 yards shore a seine within five hundred yards of either shore of said
 river, the boat, seine, tackle, and every thing therein shall
 be liable to be seized and sold as aforesaid.

Compensation **SEC. 3.** *And be it enacted,* That any person or persons
 of those giving other than the occupant of said shores, giving information
 information that shall lead to the conviction of said trespassers, shall
 be entitled to one half of said sale.

Inconsistent **SEC. 4.** *And be it enacted,* That all acts of Assembly
 acts repealed repugnant to this act, shall be, and the same are hereby re-
 pealed.

Passed April 3, 1841. *An act to divorce Mary Ann Fowler, of the City of Balti-
 more, from her husband Benjamin Fowler.*

Divorced *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,
 That Mary Ann Fowler be, and she is hereby divorced
 from her husband Benjamin Fowler, a vinculo matrimonii.*

CHAPTER 15.

Passed April 3, 1841. *An act to divorce Mary Ann R. Fisher, of Dorchester
 County, from her husband Levin T. Fisher.*

Divorced *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,
 That Mary Ann R. Fisher be, and she is hereby divorced
 from her husband Levin T. Fisher, a vinculo matrimonii.*
