Passed April 6, An act for the relief of Counter Securities of Executors 1841.

An act for the relief of Counter Securities of Executors and Administrators.

On application Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, orphans court That upon an application to the orphans' court of any to demand fur-ther security county, by any person who has become the counter security of an executor or administrator, setting forth that he conceives him or herself in danger of suffering from said securityship, such orphans' court shall have power to call upon such executor or administrator, to give other security, If such security to be approved by the court; and in the event of failure by be not given the executor or administrator to give such security, the same proceedings shall be had, in order to have the assets still remaining in the hands of such executor or administrator, delivered up, as are prescribed by the act of seventeen hundred and ninety-eight, chapter one hundred and one, sub-chapter fourteen, section eleven; and the said counter security shall have the same remedies that are given
