WHEREAS, Henry W. Gibson, Elijah Jean, George Preamble Grubb, John R. Pedrick, William Ford, Joshua Crooks, John Maloney, Jacob Ball, Samuel W. T. Daley, and others, have formed themselves into a society for the purpose of affording relief to each other in their respective families in the event of sickness, distress and death, and have prayed for an act of incorporation, that they may better execute their benevolent intentions-Therefore, Daniel and acti

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Individuals in-Maryland, That Henry W. Gibson, Elijah Jean, George corporated Grubb, John R. Pedrick, William Ford, Joshua Crooks, John Maloney, Jacob Ball, Samuel W. T. Daley, and others who now are or may hereafter become members of said society, and their successors, are hereby declared to be one community and body corporate, by the name, style and Name and style title of the Western Beneficial Society of Baltimore, and by that name they shall be, and are hereby made able and capable in law, to receive contributions, and purchase, possess, May hold proenjoy and retain to them and their successors, lands, tene- perty, &c. ments, rents, annuities, or other hereditaments, and the same to dispose of in such manner as they may judge most conducive to the interest of the said society; provided, that the Limit which in said corporation or body politic, shall not at any one time hold or possess property, real, personal or mixed, exceeding the sum of ten thousand dollars; and provided also, that Proviso nothing herein contained shall be construed to authorise or empower said society to do or perform any act not necessary to the attainment of the benevolent purpose for which the said society is herein declared to be incorporated.

SEC. 2. And be it enacted, That said society and their Legal capacity successors by the aforesaid name, shall forever hereafter be able and capable in law to sue and be sued in all or any on electrons courts of justice whatsoever; and the said society may also By-laws adopt such by-laws and regulations as they may deem necessary for the government thereof, the authentication of its acts, and the proper management of its concerns; provided, that the same shall not be contrary to any provisions of this act, or the laws of this State or of the United States.

SEC. 3. And be it enacted, That it shall and may be Elect officers lawful for the members of the said society to elect such agreements and bargains whatsoever, for the purpose and
