SEC. 4. *And be it enacted*, That nothing in this act shall be construed, so as to authorize the said corporation to issue any note, token, device, scrip or other evidence of debt, to be used as currency. Banking for-

SEC. 5. *And be it enacted*, That this act of incorporation shall inure for thirty years from its passage, and that the legislature reserves to itself the right to alter or annul this act of incorporation at pleasure. In force

CHAPTER 155.

An act to extend the time for making Collections by Christian Shepard, late Collector of Washington County. Passed Feb
28, 1842.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That Christian Shepard, late collector of Washington county, be and he is hereby allowed until the first day of January, eighteen hundred and forty-four. Time exten-
ded

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted*, That it shall be the duty of the said Christian Shepard, before he proceeds to execute or distrain the property of any person or persons, for taxes due in virtue of this act, to deliver to such person or persons, chargeable with the same, at least twenty days previous to the levying such execution or distress, an account, written in words in full length, of the property assessed, and the rate of tax thereon demanded of him, her or them, with an affidavit annexed thereto, that he hath not received any part thereof, nor any thing in security or satisfaction for the same, more than the credits given, to the best of his knowledge.
