CHAPTER 165.

An act for the relief of Penelope D. Goodwin, of Balti-Passed March more County.

1, 1842.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, To set aside That Baltimore county court is hereby authorized and required to set aside the inquisition fund, for the Baltimore and Susquehannah Rail Road Company, condemning the lands of Penelope D. Goodwin of said county, and that said court direct an inquisition de novo to be taken, and that such proceedings be had as in cases where inquisitions in similar cases are set aside by the court.

CHAPTER 166.

An act to divorce Sarah A. Dove, of Prince George's Passed March County, from her husband William Dove. 1, 1342.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Divorced Maryland, That Sarah A. Dove, be and she is hereby divorced from her husband William Dove, a vinculo matrimonii.
