which provided for the appointment of a judge of the land office for the eastern shore, be and the same is hereby repealed. **CHAP. 320.**

**SEC. 2.** *And be it enacted,* That the duties heretofore performed by the judge of the land office of the eastern shore, from and after the passage of this act, be performed by the Chancellor of this State; and the said Chancellor be and he is hereby required to perform and execute all and singular the duties, which under existing laws, are now performed by the judge of the land office of the eastern shore. **Chancellor to perform all the duties of judge.**

**SEC. 3.** *And be it enacted,* That all laws and resolutions inconsistent with the provisions of this act, be and the same are hereby repealed. **Repealed.**

CHAPTER 319.

*An act to confirm an act, to alter and amend the Constitution of this State.* **Passed March 10, 1842.**

*Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* an act entitled, an act to alter and amend the constitution of this State, passed April sixth, eighteen hundred and forty-one, chapter fifty-five, be and the same is hereby confirmed. **Confirmed.**

CHAPTER 320.

*An act for the relief of Thomas M. D. Baden, former Collector of Taxes, of Prince George's County.* **Passed March 10, 1842.**

*Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the time allowed Thomas M. D. Baden, former collector of taxes in Prince George's county, by the act of December session, eighteen hundred and forty, chapter one hundred and ninety-four, be and the same is hereby extended to the first day of December, eighteen hundred and forty-two. **Time extended.**
