CHAPTER 322.

*An act for the payment of the Journal of Accounts.* Passed March 10, 1842

WHEREAS, it appears by the journal of accounts of this session, that there is due from this State the sum of forty-six thousand three hundred and sixty-one dollars and twenty-four cents—therefore,

*Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* Treasurer to pay  
That the treasurer of the western shore of Maryland, be and he is hereby authorized and required to pay the several persons, their executors, administrators or orders, or to such of them as shall offer to receive the same, the several sums of money allowed to them respectively, as they appear to be settled and ascertained by said journal, out of any money now in the treasury subject to appropriation by the General Assembly.

CHAPTER 323.

*An act entitled, a further supplement to an act entitled, an act relating to Free Negroes and Slaves.* Passed March 10, 1842

*Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* The act of 1839, not to affect the act of 1832  
That nothing in the act of eighteen hundred and thirty-nine, chapter fifteen, shall be construed in any manner to affect or change the act of eighteen hundred and thirty-two, chapter-forty.

CHAPTER 324.

*An act to authorize James Shipley, late Collector of the Third Collection District of Anne Arundel County, further time to complete his collections.* Passed March 10, 1842.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* Time allowed  
That James Shipley, one of the late collectors of Anne Arundel county, be and he is hereby authorized
