Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the treasurer of the western shore pay to John N. Stewart the sum of six dollars, for his services as page to this house for three days at the commencement of the present session.

Resolution authorizing the Adjutant General to furnish Captain Samuel Whittington, with Arms, &c.

10, 1842.

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Adjutant General be and he is hereby authorized and directed to deliver to Captain Samuel Whittington, of Calvert county, thirty-five rifles with all necessary accoutrements, upon his giving bond and security for their safe keeping and return, whenever required to do so.

No. 49.

Resolution directing the Librarian to allow to David Ridgely, Esquire, free use of the State's Library.

10, 1842.

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That David Ridgely of the city of Annapolis, shall be allowed as free access to and use of the State Library as the members of the Legislature, or the Executive, or the Judges of the Court of Appeals.
