An act to incorporate the Trustees of Bethel School House, Passed Feb in Cecil County. 10, 1842.

> WHEREAS, a public school has been organized at or near Bethel meeting house in Cecil county, and the following persons appointed as trustees, viz: Samuel Thompson, David D. Pearce, John L. Clayton, John R. Price and James Kennady, and have desired an act of incorporation-therefore,

SECTION 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Incorporated. Maryland, That the said trustees above named, and their successors, shall be a body corporate, and shall have suc-Name and cession by the name and style of the Trustees of the Bethel style.
