

**CHAP. 172.** SEC. 2. *And be it enacted,* That the said corporation and their successors by the name and title aforesaid, shall be capable in law to sue and be sued, plead and be impleaded, answer and be answered unto, defend and be defended, in all or any courts of law and equity, and before all or any judges, officers or persons whatsoever, in all and singular actions, matters or demands whatsoever.

Common seal. SEC. 3. *And be it enacted,* That it shall and may be lawful for the said corporation to have a common seal for their use, and the same at their will and pleasure to change, alter or make anew from time to time as they may think best, and shall in general have and exercise all such rights, privileges and immunities as by law are incident or necessary to corporations, and what may be necessary to the corporation herein constituted, and to enable members of said order to exercise all things concerning the design of this corporation, for the benevolent relief of the sick and distressed, and for the promotion of their purposes generally.

Right of legislature reserved. SEC. 4. *And be it enacted,* That it shall and may be lawful at any time for the general assembly to demand a statement of the amount of property real and personal belonging to the said corporation, and of the debts due to and from the said corporation, and the purposes for which disbursements shall have been made, and shall also have the right to authorize one or more persons to inspect such general accounts in the books of the corporation as shall relate to such statements.

Issues forbid. SEC. 5. *And be it enacted,* That this corporation shall not be permitted to issue any note, token or device, scrip or other evidence of debt to be used as a currency.

To enure for 30 years. SEC. 6. *And be it enacted,* That this act shall enure for thirty years, and the Legislature reserves to itself the right to change, alter or annul this act of incorporation at pleasure.
