## CHAPTER 190.

Passed March A supplement to the act entitled, an act to prevent Gaming; 4, 1843. passed at December session, one thousand eight hundred and twenty-six, chapter eighty-eight.

SECTION 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Guilty of a misdemeanor. Maryland, That it shall not be lawful to keep a gaming table, and that any one who shall keep a gaming table, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and for every such offence shall pay a fine of one hundred dollars, and any person who shall at any time hereafter appear, act or behave, as the person having the care, government or management of a gaming table, shall be deemed and taken as the keeper thereof.

SEC. 2. And be it enacted, That every one who shall keep Fine of \$100. a gaming house, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and for each offence shall pay a fine of one hundred dollars.

SEC. 3. And be it enacted, That every one who shall Fine of \$20, and each beta bet, or wager either directly or indirectly, money or any seperate of the thing at any of the gaming tables prohibited by this seperate other thing, at any of the gaming tables prohibited by this fence. act, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and for such offence shall pay a fine of twenty dollars, and each bet or wager shall be considered a seperate offence under this act.

SEC. 4. And be it enacted, That every Faro Table, E Gaming tables O. table, Equality, or any other kind of gaming table (Billiard table excepted) at which the game faro, equality, or any other game of chance shall be played for money, or any other thing, any such table shall be deemed a gaming table within the meaning of this act.
