

## CHAPTER 203.

CHAP. 204

*A further supplement to an act entitled, An act to establish a Bank and incorporate a company under the title of The Planters Bank of Prince George's County.* Passed March 7, 1843.

WHEREAS it is represented to this General Assembly, that the stockholders of the Planters Bank of Prince George's county have for the purpose of winding up the said institution with as little inconvenience to the public as possible, divided among themselves, the debts due to the said bank, having first paid all the liabilities of the said bank, and which it is supposed by some of the stockholders, who have received an assignment of debts in payment of their stock, that it may be doubtful whether the said assignees would have power to collect their said debts, in the name of the said bank, and doubts being also entertained by the purchasers of real estate from said bank as to the legal sufficiency of the deeds which were executed by S. Sprigg as the President of said Bank, and it appearing right to this General Assembly, that all doubts in regard thereto should be put to rest—therefore,

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the stockholders of the Planter's Bank of Prince George's county, and others, who received assignments from said bank, of bonds, notes, or judgments, shall be and they are hereby empowered and authorised to prosecute the said claims so assigned to them, in the name of the said bank in any court of law or equity in this state, in the same manner and to the same extent, as if the said bank had not forfeited its charter.

Preamble.  
Stockholders & others may prosecute the claims, &c.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted,* That all conveyances of real estate made by Samuel Sprigg Esq. as the president of said bank, shall be good and effectual to convey all the rights title and interest, of said bank to the grantors in said deeds, named as fully as if it were the intention of the said Samuel Sprigg to convey the same in and by the said deeds.

Conveyances made by Sam. Sprigg, Pres. shall be good.

## CHAPTER 204.

*An act to incorporate a Company to construct a Turnpike Road from Frostburg, Allegany County, down the valley of Jennings's Run, to intersect the Turnpike recently constructed by the Maryland and New York Iron and Coal Company, at or near the Mount Savage Iron Works.* Passed March 3, 1843.
