SECTION 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Court to exam-Maryland, That the Orphan's Court of Harford county in accounts. shall have full power to examine the accounts of any teacher presented for payment out of the School Fund, and if any fraud is practised to reject such account.

SEC. 5. And be it enacted, That the Orphan's Court are authorized to recover all accounts and certificates to pre-fund properly vent frauds, and to see that the funds are properly applied applied. according to the charitable and humane designs of the law.

SEC. 6. And be it enacted, That no school commis- Commissionsioner shall be considered elected unless he receives a ma- er to receive jority of all the votes cast in his election district; and in majority case of failure to elect, or if there occur vacancies from any cause, then the Orphan's Court shall appoint suitable persons to fill such vacancies, and no commissioner appointed by the Orphan's Court shall be entitled to any compensation for his services.
