

RESOLUTIONS.

1842

*Resolved, by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the Adjutant General be and is hereby authorized, to deliver to Capt. Samuel Whittington, of Calvert county, the additional number of five rifles, with their necessary accoutrements, provided they are in the Armory, upon the said Whittington's giving a sufficient bond for their safe keeping and return whenever required to do so.

Resolution in relation to the estate of Col. A. Jessup. Passed March 8, 1843.

WHEREAS it has been represented to this General Assembly by the petition of many tax payers and others residents of Baltimore county, that a judgment has been obtained against Abraham Jessup as the security of Samuel Jordan formerly a collector of taxes for Baltimore county; it is further represented that the said Abraham Jessup is now deceased and has left an infant daughter about seven years old, who will be left entirely destitute if the said judgment is enforced and the petitioners pray that the said judgment be released—therefore,

*Be it resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That all the right claim and interest of Baltimore county in and to said judgment against the said Abraham Jessup be and the same is hereby released.

No. 27.

Resolution in favor of the Penitentiary. Passed March 4, 1843.

*Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the treasurer of the western shore, be authorised and directed to pay to the Directors of the Maryland Penitentiary the sum of fifteen thousand dollars out of any unappropriated money in the treasury in such sums and at such times as the wants of said penitentiary may require.

*And be it further resolved,* That upon the passage of these resolutions said directors shall make a detailed statement to the treasurer of the western shore, of the sums necessary to meet the wants of said penitentiary and at what dates the payment requisite shall become due.
