

Passed March 8, 1843. Resolution relating to damages sustained by certain persons at tobacco warehouse. No. 2. Baltimore.

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the treasurer be and he is hereby directed to pay out of any unappropriated money in the treasury belonging to the tobacco fund, the sum of four thousand one hundred and thirty-nine dollars, for the use and benefit of those who had tobacco damaged by the flood at No. 2. warehouse in the city of Baltimore on the twenty-fourth day of August last, as follows: to the order of
